With us from BCG will be **two project leaders, Lise Lørup (PhD in Biomedical Engineering from The University of Oxford) and Øyvind Berle (PhD in Shipping from NTNU and MIT)**, who both look forward to meeting you for a chat about the ins and outs of the world of consulting.

### **NIFU-webinar: How have Norwegian institutions of higher education been affected by Covid-19? (in Norwegian)**

Finally, we would like to bring your attention to a **webinar on March 19th 2021 from 12:30 PM - 01:30 PM** by the Norwegian Institute for Studies on Innovation, Research and Education (NIFU). The webinar will **delve into the results from an investigation into how the institutions of higher education have handled the pandemic so far**, and is based on survey answers from around 22.000 students and 4000 staff members. The investigation seeks to address **how the pandemic has affected the quality of education and research (collaborations), and what competencies have been acquired in teaching digitally**. Performed by NIFU for the Ministry of Education, the results are to be used in the future when deciding policies on education.
